

# Download United States, Appellants V. John W. Low Et Al.

United States v. Schooner Amistad, 40 U.S. (15 Pet.) 518 (1841), was a United States Supreme Court case resulting from the rebellion of Africans on board the Spanish schooner La Amistad in 1839. It was an unusual freedom suit that involved international issues and parties, as well as United States law.No. 1. APPEAL FROM THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT.
